- March 27 – April 13** Graduates are to see Mrs. Purvis in the Guidance Office. You must give your correct height in shoes as this will determine the length of your Graduation gown. **Total amount of money is due at this time. Dates will not be extended.**
- April 15th** Completed Grad profiles due to Student Services.
- May 18th** **Board-wide Grad Celebration:** Bus leaves Saint Paul in the morning. Uniforms must be worn and attendance is **mandatory**. Details to follow.
- June 9th** **Prom:** Friday, June 9th @ the Americana Resort.
- June 13th at 9:00 am** **Closing School Liturgy:** Graduates are to line up outside of the gymnasium in alphabetical order. Formal dress is required. You will then proceed as a group to reserved seating in gymnasium. Parents are welcome to attend the Liturgy.

Finally, Student Council Presidential Elections were held for the 2017-2018 year. A big congratulations goes Taya Cesar as she will lead the new council!

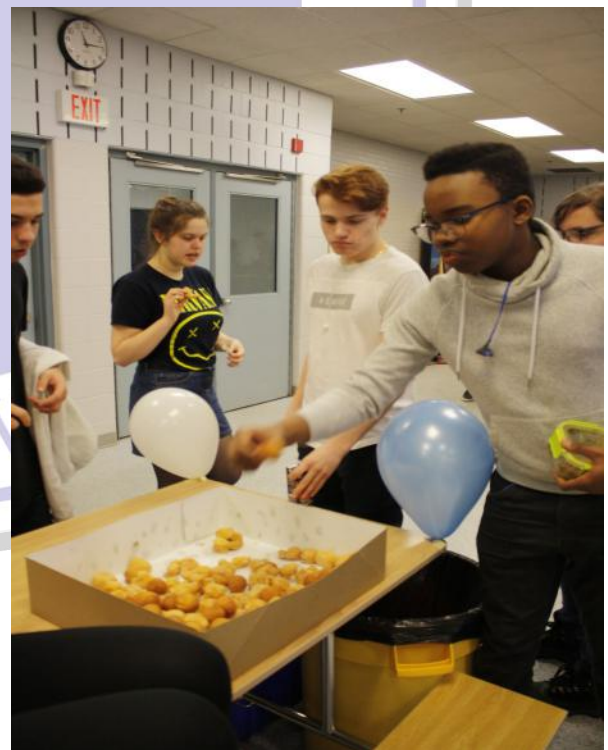
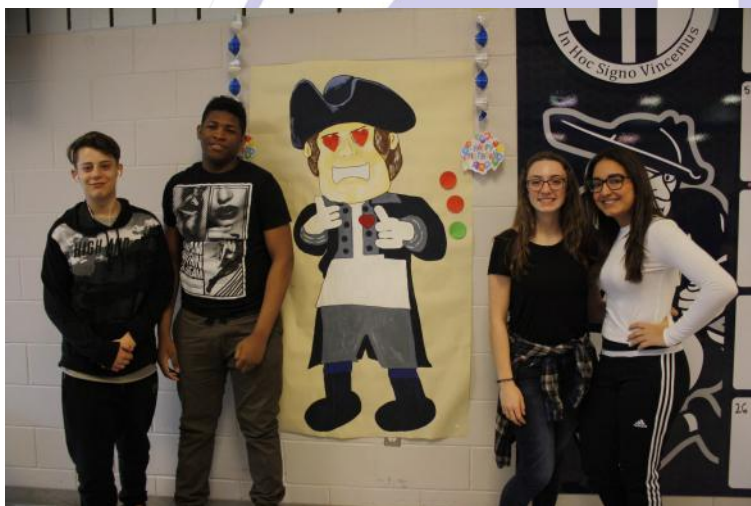

Director Crocco presented the *Design of System Priorities 2017-2018* and asked the SEAC for their participation by submitting a measurable action verb System Priority for 2017-2018.
